Anne Barrett is Imperial College London Archivist & Corporate Records Manager,

She describes her job:

'As much about looking forward as looking back, collecting today for tomorrow:

If I am not aware of what is happening in Imperial's life today, I can't ensure we have a full record of Imperial, its work and culture to inform Imperial's future life.'

Background and early career

Anne has worked at Imperial College London since 1982, coming from 2 years at the Radcliffe Science Library in Oxford, she worked in Imperial's library, creating the conservation style book repair system and becoming the Preservation Officer.

This experience led her to being recruited to lead Imperial's Archives in 1989, and also to being one of the few people who has taken both the Librarianship and the Archive Administration Diplomas at University College London, in 1985 and 1992 respectively.

She gained her MA on *George Eliot's Reading* whilst undertaking her Diploma in Librarianship, and is working on a PhD relating to an aspect of Imperial's 19th century archival collections.

Academic Papers and Talks Given

Anne has a track record of giving seminars talks and conference papers on her thesis material, archival matters and the history of Imperial for her work at Imperial, and also nationally and internationally.

Contribution to the Archive and Records Management Community: Committees and Mentoring

Anne has worked on many archival and history of science related committees, believing that members should actively contribute to the purpose of the committee, not simply sit on a committee.

She also believes it important to assist new members of the profession **e.g.** through mentoring, either for her team members in their early career, or via the ARA mentoring scheme.

ARA magazine contributions selecting topics and seeking out contributors to write content and editing for the Science Archives issues of the ARA Magazine.

Women Wikithon Anne runs this annually, online, with external colleagues in engineering and culture. **Purpose**: to improve on or add new entries about women in STEM to Wikipedia. Editor training is given and anyone who books onto the session can contribute.

Introducing Data Protection systems for the 1st act in 1998, thereby laying the foundation for Imperial's full time Data Protection section today; introducing a digital records management system, and a digital preservation system, (Archivematica) across Imperial.

Culture

Instigating Imperial's annual Act of Remembrance with the College Chaplain from 2014 to commemorate the start of WWI and the involvement of Imperial's members, at which attendance can exceed 100 people.

Staging major exhibitions over the years to celebrate Imperial's landmarks, including the Centenary in 2007, for which she wrote the timeline for the website, Anne contributes to the information about Imperial available to internal and external interests.

Anne was archival advisor on Imperial's History Group in 2020-2023, and, since then, extending her archival responsibility for Imperial's artwork, she is Co-Chair of the Artwork Group, with the remit to commission portraiture of underrepresented people of Imperial, past and laying strong foundations for the future of that work.
